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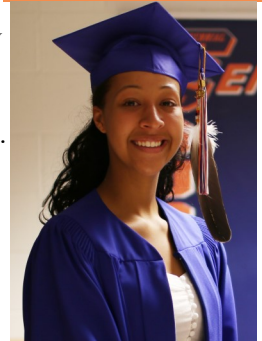

Last month, our math team participated in the final Waterloo math competition of the year. It is a group format in which students write individually, with the top five scores making up the team score. Our grade 9 team, consisting of Donghwui Kim, Nico Damelio, Jordan Jacobi, Jacob Thomas and

Chase Kish, placed first in our zone. Our grade 10 team placed a very respectable fourth in the zone. Ruby Kong, a grade 11 student, placed in the top 25 percent and earned a certificate of distinction. We are very proud of all of the accomplishments of our team this year and look forward building on our success next year.

WCSS STILL #1 IN MICROSOFT TESTS

Centennial continues to set the standard as the #1 school in Ontario and #2 in Canada, with over 300 certifications over the last 3 years. This year over 90 students at WCSS earned a Microsoft Office User Specialist designation. It was an impressive result, and Centennial's first time competing at the provincial level.

Escape From Syria was the most recognized production at the National Theatre School Festival Provincial Showcase (top 12 plays in Ontario), earning two Awards of Excellence and one MIRA Award. 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CAMP OUT FOR A CAUSE

The Centennial Cougars raised exactly \$25,278.24 for Campout For A Cause in memory of Mr. Kevin Krasnay. Nearly 430 Welland Centennial Secondary School students surpassed their goal of \$20,000 that will benefit two organizations that helped him during his battle with lung cancer. Mr. Krasnay taught at WCSS and Eastdale S.S. Students and staff raised enough money to make \$10,000 donations to each Wellspring Niagara and Hospice Niagara, where Mr. Krasnay received care before his death. Mr. Krasnay built many sets



and stage props used in drama productions at the high school, and was also the lead on the miniature structures at the Niagara Safety Village, teaching many students about construction in the process.

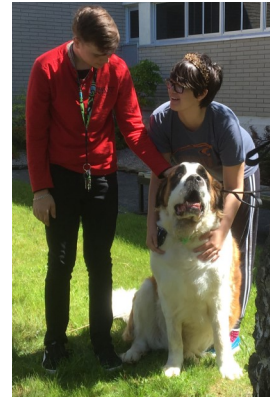
RE-BRANDING SAFE SCHOOL TEAM TO CENTENNIAL CHANGEMAKERS



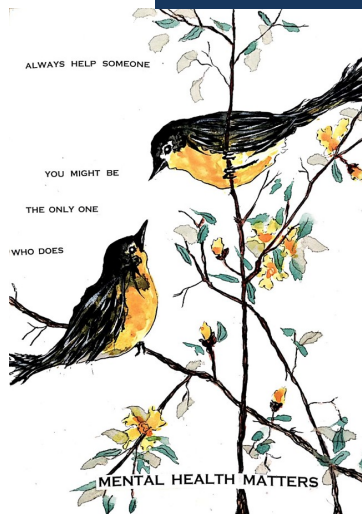

Nancy heads a national campaign which provides moccasins to Foster Care agencies so that newborn babies who are in the system are given a cultural artifact which will travel with them to their new homes. Students spent an afternoon crafting moccasins, and crafting a note of encouragement and support which was then attached to the moccasins.
