### COUGARS ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Once again, Welland Centennial students have distinguished themselves on the provincial math and literacy tests. Our students achieved an overall pass rate of 86% on the OSSLT, a graduation requirement. This is well above the provincial average and the highest score of all Welland secondary schools. Our Academic Math students set the standard for DSBN with a board-high success rate of 90%. Well done to all of our students and thanks to the dedicated teachers who prepared them for these important assessments.

Province wide disruptions caused the cancellation of the recent on-line trial OSSLT. Our students handled the challenges of the day with calmness and maturity. We will continue to prepare students for the March 30, 2017 test to ensure that they are equipped to meet this graduation requirement.

### BACK TO THE FUTURE

2016 marks WCSS's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and to celebrate, the Alumni Committee held events on Sat., Oct. 8<sup>th</sup>. The day started with an open house and tours given by the current members of Student Council so former staff, students and their families could see the changes and upgrades that have happened at our school.
